Notice of Annual Meeting



TO: All Members of Lea County Electric Cooperative, Inc.

Notice is hereby given that the 2023 Annual Meeting of Members of Lea County Electric Cooperative, Inc. will be held Friday, April 28, 2023, with registration from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., MDT, at 1300 W. Avenue D, Lovington, New Mexico, the Lea County Electric Cooperative's main office. The business session of the meeting will be streamed live on the Lea County Electric Facebook page at 6:00 p.m., MDT. The meeting will be conducted in a drive-through process. Said meeting is in compliance with the adopted bylaws of the Cooperative and is for the purpose of electing two Trustees, passing upon reports from the previous calendar year, and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting.

Registration of members will be held Friday, April 28, 2023, during business hours at the following locations: at the main office of the Cooperative, 1300 W. Avenue D, Lovington, New Mexico, or at the Tatum district office, at 203 South Main Street, Tatum, New Mexico, or at the Plains district office, at 1547 U.S. Highway 82, Plains, Texas.

The business session of the meeting will be streamed live on the Lea County Electric Facebook page at 6:00 p.m., MDT, at which the following will be addressed: 1) the establishment of a quorum; 2) a reading of the secretary's Notice of the meeting and proof of mailing to members; 3) approval of minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting; presentation and consideration of reports from officers, trustees, and committees; and 4) an election by the membership of two Trustees one from District Three and one from District Eight for the year 2023 Annual Meeting.

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 4 of the Bylaws, a Committee on Nominations, was appointed and met on March 7, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for the election of two Trustees: one from District Three and one from District Eight for the 2023 meeting. A list of said nominations of Trustees was prepared and posted at the office of Lea County Electric Cooperative, Inc., 1300 West Avenue D, Lovington, New Mexico, and each district office.

According to the bylaws, other nominations may be made by petition signed by 15 or more members acting together, no less than 20 days prior to the date of the annual meeting of members. A list of any nominations by petition will likewise be prepared and posted. All nominations, including those by the Committee on Nominations and those by petition, will be submitted to and acted upon by the membership at the Annual Meeting. A statement of the number of Trustees to be elected and the names and addresses of the candidates (the nominations made by the Committee on Nominations and nominations made by petition, if any, being listed separately as required in the bylaws) will be mailed to the members with this Notice of the Annual Meeting.

Article III, Section 5 of the Bylaws states in part: Each person who otherwise qualifies and who wishes to vote shall register for the member meeting and shall be entitled to only one vote on each matter submitted to a vote at a Meeting of the Members. Voting persons other than members who are natural persons shall be allowed by the presentation to the Cooperative, prior to or upon registration at each Member Meeting, of satisfactory evidence entitling the person presenting the same to vote. Voting authorization forms are available at the Cooperative's main office at 1300 West Avenue D, Lovington, New Mexico, and at the district offices in Tatum and Plains or by calling 575-396-3631.

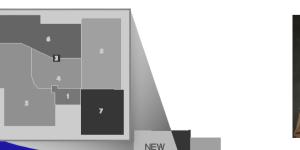

Year in Review

First and foremost, we want to thank all our members for their support throughout 2022. As we entered 2022, we were optimistic in hopes of having the pandemic behind us. However, in the financial world, the word inflation kept us cautious. As the year transpired, we experienced record inflation. Increased costs and long lead times in materials increased substantially, making meeting deadlines on system projects and member requests challenging. Despite these obstacles, we continued to work hard to maintain our mission statement: "Lea County Electric is a community-focused cooperative that strives to be innovative and environmentally friendly while providing its members high value, low cost, and safe reliable service."

The Cooperative has worked hard to upgrade and maintain its distribution system. It began by adding load to the system of over 20,000 horsepower (hp) related to oil and gas requests and more than 1,800 hp for irrigation. The staking department worked over 375 jobs. In 2022 several miles of line were converted to a larger conductor to accommodate growth. Over 100 idle services were retired. The design for upgrades of the Plains and Waits Interchanges has begun along with the new South Lovington Substation. The South Lovington Substation will be reconstructed entirely and built on the west side of Arkansas Junction. The annual pole inspection consisted of 4,947 poles inspected, and only 174 were rejected.

In 2022 we began a Cost-of-Service Study to evaluate our rates. This study makes sure that each rate class is covering their proportionate share of the cooperative's expenses. The Study resulted in a small rate increase due to the increase in the cooperative's operating costs along with rising wholesale power prices and increasing regulatory requirements.

As a cooperative we value our 7th Cooperative Principle, "Concern for Community". We not only focus on our members needs but also the development of our communities. This year three local organizations, Lovington Youth Sports Organization, Lovington Food Coalition, and Back pack for Kids received \$15,000 combined grants through the Sharing Success program sponsored by

CoBank. In addition, LCEC also granted over \$32,000 to local schools, groups, and organizations.

Here at LCEC we are invested in our youth since they are our future. We created a program, Bright Ideas, to assist local teachers with innovative classroom programs. Since the mid-1980s, the Cooperative has been able to grant scholarships to students that are dependents of active members. Twenty students received the one-time \$7,500 scholarship in 2022. which has been increased to \$8,000 for this upcoming fall. We proudly participate in the annual livestock sales at Gaines, Lea, and Yoakum Counties donating close to \$45,000. The Cooperative distributed \$1.1 million in capital credits, which represented 50% of the patronage allocated for 1999 for those who were members at that time. Each year we conduct safety presentations to teach our communities and youth all about electrical safety. Our LCEC employees have participated in local career days highlighting the many careers in a Cooperative varying from engineering, accounting, marketing, customer service, lineman, to information technology. Every October, we proudly host our Member Appreciation events in Lovington, Tatum, and Plains; this allows us to visit and personally thank everyone for their membership and support.

We look forward to seeing everyone at the Annual Meeting of the Members scheduled for Friday, April 28. Last year's Annual Meeting was well attended by 833 registered members. We will continue to have the drive-through registration at the Lovington, New Mexico office. Tatum, New Mexico, and Plains, Texas offices will be in-lobby registration. Thanks again for your trust in Lea County Electric Cooperative.
